Springboro City Schools offers to students in grades K – 12 the opportunity to be involved in the extra-curricular activity...Destination ImagiNation!

Destination ImagiNation is a creative problem solving activity designed to enhance teamwork, creative problem solving, creative thinking and expression skills. Teams of seven students and an adult manager work to solve a “Challenge.” Teams develop the solution, design and build all props and costumes and prepare for the presentation of their solution at the Region XIV Tournament in March. K – 2 students participate in all aspects of the program, but in a non-competitive introductory format. Students in grades 3 – 12 do compete for trophies, special awards and for invitations to compete at the state and global levels.

As a member of a DI team, you will attend team-scheduled practices. New teams usually meet once a week to begin with, expanding to twice a week through the winter. Depending on the team’s progress, as March approaches, some teams may schedule more practices. Due to the team nature of this program, the specifics are set by the individual teams and managers.

Your team will select one challenge out of a list of five different problems. One is for our technical DI’ers. A more scientific approach is on deck for our second challenge and robots will be involved this year. The true thespians are “Gonna Flip” this season and flip flops aren’t just for feet anymore. The Improvisational Challenge is for our creative types who love to live on the edge. What’s black and white and read all over? It’s our structure challenge with constructors and destructors. Of course our younger DI’ers (K – 2nd grade) have a challenge all their own to present in exhibition at the competition in March. So if you are ready for mind-bending, problem solving fun and much more detail about these fun challenges, fill this form out and send it back to school now!
