

Districts and schools receive overall grades for the first time


One new addition to the report card is the overall summative grade. Each school and district earns an overall letter grade that provides a quick snapshot of overall performance. More than three-quarters of districts received a "C" or higher, with more than a third receiving a "B" or higher. Approximately 40 percent of schools received a "B" or higher. The overall grade is a first look, but it is important to dig deeper into the data to identify strengths and areas for improvement.



What's new in Ohio School Report Cards for 2018?

Overall Letter Grades for Schools and Districts

For the first time, schools and districts will be assigned overall letter grades. The overall grade is calculated by using results in the six components: Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Improving At-Risk K-3 Readers, Graduation Rate and Prepared for Success. When a school or district has letter grades for all six components, the overall grade is determined using the following weights:







Achievement - Final Grade

Performance Index

The Performance Index measures the test results of every student, not just those who score proficient or higher. There are seven levels on the index and districts receive points for every student who takes a test. The higher the achievement level, the more points awarded in the district's index. This rewards schools and districts for improving the performance of all students, regardless of achievement level.

Indicators Met

Indicators Met measures the percent of students who have passed state tests. It also includes the gifted indicator and the chronic absenteeism indicator. Test results are reported for each student in a grade and subject. The passage rate for each test indicator is 80% and the End of Course (EOC) Improvement Indicator is 25%.

Students in the Lowest 20% in Achievement


This measures the progress for students identified as the lowest 20% statewide in reading, math, or science achievement.




Students with Disabilities

This measures the progress for students with disabilities.


Gap Closing - English Language Arts







How Prepared were Your 2016 and 2017 Graduating Classes?


